TWENTY-THIRD YEAR

FIFTEEN LIVES LOST BY A RAILWAY WRECK

**Rear-End Collision in the New York
Central Tunnel Brings Death
and Injury.**

**HEEROIC ATTEMPTS AT RESCUE
Victims Mangled By Wreck, Crushed
By Boiler of Train As It Escaped Tunnel.**

New York, Jan. 8.—The rear-end collision between the New York Central train and the Erie train at 8:17 o'clock this morning and 15 passengers were killed and twice that number were injured. A dozen of the injured were seriously hurt and the roster of the dead may be extended.

Rear-End Collision.
It was a rear-end collision between a South Newark local that ran over the New York, New Haven and Hartford and was halted by block signal at the southern entrance to the tunnel, and a White Plains local, that came by the Harlem branch of the New York Central. Most of the deaths and injuries were caused by the engine of the White Plains train, which plunged into the rear car of the South Newark train. It swept away the platform and wedged its way through the car to the middle of the car, smashing the seats and furnishings and splitting the boiler as it burst forward. In many instances, the victims were killed by being crushed or mangled by the boiler.

Awful Fatal Plunge.
The engine in its final plunge, 49 feet carried the boiler and rear car and seat twisted iron, broken sladders and splinters crashing into the coach above. Lights and windows were shattered. Many passengers and unharmed were left in darkness that could not be seen and many were mangled by the boiler.
