THE COMING TRIP 'ROUND THE WORLD

Sure To Be a Most Enjoyable Affair—Outline of the Attractions.

In addition to the regular programme, which will be conducted in the main hall, and which will consist of "The Grand March," the "Grand Drill" under direction of Mr. O'Donnell, the "Cadet Fancy Drill," and the fancy drill by the Collegiate girls, under the direction of Mr. Gregory, there will be musical and literary entertainments in each booth, the music, singing, dancing and entertaining being altogether characteristic of the country represented.

The Scotch concert will entice many of the St. Andrew's Society to the Scotch booth, where a delightful evening is promised, with Mr. Cyril Dwight-Edwards, Canada's foremost baritone, in charge.

The thatched cottage which represents Ireland will interest the Irish Brevet Society and all the sons of Erin.

The Dutch booth is delightfully quaint and picturesque, and will be one of the most attractive in the armories.

Afternoon tea, à la Anglaise, will be served from the cabin of an ocean liner, the ladies to be in sailor costume.

The French booth, with Mrs. Gervard in charge, will be typical of Parisian life.

With Mrs. Harold Richardson in charge of the American booth, and assisted by some American ladies now resident in the city, it goes without saying that this booth will be one of the most popular in the fête.

The Italian, Swiss and Spanish booths, with their picturesque attendants, and the sweet music of the Italian harpers, and the Spanish guitar, will no doubt prove a great attraction to a large number.

The Canadian booth is dear to everyone. There are none who are not interested in this booth, and with its purely Canadian goods and eatables it is expected that it will be most liberally patronized.

The Japanese booth, however, in charge of Mrs. (Dr.) C. T. Campbell, bids fair to be a strong rival. The Japanese tea-room, matronized by Mrs. Samuel Stevely and Mrs. (Dr.) C. W. CHINESE FAMINE BROKER

Weather Conditions Give Promise of Good Crop Yield.

Shanghai, May 30.—The famine which has prevailed for many weeks, causing hundreds of deaths and great suffering, has been broken. The crops are still thin, but the hot weather of the past month has been favorable to a good yield.

American gifts have supplied milk regularly to 1,000 babies at the Hsu Chiao Fu Temple, while 300 more have been nourished occasionally. The children are left with their parents or relations, as the Chinese dread foreign orphanages.

What is left of the gift will be turned over to the Red Cross Society to relieve individual cases of need and to grapple with the next crisis.

BALLOON BLOWN TO SEA

Military Aeronauts Missing When Bag Was Picked Up.

London, May 30.—A military balloon, piloted by Lieutenants Caulfield and Leake, of the Royal Engineers, which was sent up from Aldershot camp on May 28 during the review in honor of Prince Fushimi of Japan, was picked up at sea by a fishing smack this morning, some distance from Exmouth, county of Devon, at the mouth of the Exe, in the English Channel. The fate of the two officers is a mystery, but it is hoped that they may have been picked up by a passing vessel.

King Edward and Prince Fushimi witnessed the ascent of the balloon. A strong wind which was blowing at the time soon carried it out of sight, and it was not again seen until sighted by coastguards the same evening, near Exmouth, when the balloon was being carried out to sea.

LIVELY DOINGS ARE PREDICTED

County Council Has Some Warm Sessions Ahead of It Next Week.

Lively doings are predicted when the county council begins its regular session on Monday next. A number of important questions will come up for discussion, and as there appears to be a great difference of opinion among the councilors, discussions pro and con should wax merrily.

One of the first questions to come up is that of the county assuming charge of the Guest bridge in London Township. This structure was erected about sixteen years ago, the county and the township each bearing half the expense. The Guest bridge was built with the idea of saving the county the cost of erecting three structures along the town line between London Township and Nissouri, and is built along a side road. Inasmuch as the side road runs off the town line the fifth concession, the former road is impassable beyond that point even at the present time. Some time ago the bridge was condemned, and the township made overtures to the county, asking that the latter take control of and replace it. It is highly probable that the county will assume the burden which the township has maintained since the erection of the bridge, inasmuch as it is possible for the township to insist on the bridging of the town line, which would mean a great expense to the county.

The township has another iron in the fire—the Proof Line road purchase—and it cannot, from all appearances, afford to be too hasty in any of its actions.

It will be remembered that some time ago London Township asked assistance from the Government, the county and the city, in the matter of purchasing the Proof Line road, in order to do away with the payment of tolls. Nothing definite has as yet been done in the matter, although several joint meetings have been held by the city and county councils. Recently the Government decided to grant the sum of \$3,200 toward the \$1,000 asked for the road, and it is possible that the county will give \$3,200, the city \$2,000, and the township the remainder, \$2,600.

The county roads question is one which will create a great deal of discussion, and just what the county will do in the matter is a problem. Originally the township and the Government shared equally in the cost of maintaining the main roads throughout the county, under county council bylaw 580. Recently the Government proposed that the county should assume the entire charge of the work of maintaining the main roads of the county, under the county good roads system. The Government will contribute one-third toward the work of grading, drawing, and renewing several joint meetings have been held by the city and county councils.
