Mustard Pickle Recipe—One quart of chopped onions, 1 quart chopped cucumbers, 1 quart whole cucumbers (small), 1 quart whole onions (small), 1 large cauliflower broken into small pieces, 3 red peppers, 3 green peppers; put into separate dishes, cover with a hot brine, let stand over night. Next morning drain off brine, put all together in a kettle, add 3 cups brown sugar, 16 gallon vinegar; let come to scald, then add a paste made of 2-3 cup flour, 14 pound mustard, 12 ounce turmeric, and vinegar; let come slowly to a boil, and put in quart sealers.
