THE LOCAL MARKET
Butter and eggs were the principal
offerings on the local market today, ver-
getables of all kinds being scarce. Eggs
were firm, 25 a dozen being paid for
crate lots, while the retail price was 35c
a dozen. Daily butter selling for 45c to
46c a pound, while creamery butter
brought 47c a pound. Crock butter sold
for 45c a pound.
Seed plants of all kinds formed a large
portion of the offerings. Cabbage plants
sold for 25c a bunch, seed lettuce for
25c a box, and tomato plants for 20c
a bunch. Seed onions, which have been
offered for some time, were steady at
25c to 30c a bushel. Lettuce was dif-
ficult to get, and prices ranged from
7c to 10c a bunch, and prices for a dozen
bunches. Green onions had a fairly
good market at 4c to 5c a dozen
bunches. Only a few potatoes were of-
fered, and a large portion of those for
sale were of the seed variety.
General price was 45c to 47c a bag,
but seed potatoes brought as much as
50c in many instances.
Flowers were a prominent feature,
\$1.75 a dozen. The price is higher than
in former years, gardeners claiming that
the seedlings growing this year have in-
creased greatly during the past year. Tulips
brought 25c a dozen, gladioli 20c, and
Hay was steady at 15c to 16c a ton,
and straw sold at the usual price, \$5.50
a ton. There was no change
in oats, Friday's price, \$2.25 and \$2.35
a cwt. prevailing. No wheat was of-
fered, but a bushel, but the general
price on outside markets is \$2.25 a
bushel and live hogs were firmer at \$15.75 to \$16
a cwt., and small pigs brought \$12
a cwt. and a pig of 1 over last
Saturday's price.
