

FENELON.—The year has been one of great anxiety, owing somewhat to the general failure of crops, which has materially affected our financial accounts. The membership, in most instances, have done well in contributing to the support of the Gospel. In our work, we have not labored in vain. At Fenelon Falls, two or three requested the prayers of the Church. The protracted meeting held at Verulam, resulted in bringing many souls to Jesus.

LINDSAY.—Heavy financial liabilities, on both Church and Parsonage, together with monetary depression of the times, render our work in this department very trying.
