

FENELON.—The year has been one of great anxiety, owing somewhat to the general failure of crops, which has materially affected our financial accounts. The membership, in most instances, have done well in contributing to the support of the Gospel. In our work, we have not labored in vain. At Fenelon Falls, two or three requested the prayers of the Church. The protracted meeting held at Verulam, resulted in bringing many souls to Jesus.

LINDSAY.—Heavy financial liabilities, on both Church and Parsonage, together with monetary depression of the times, render our work in this department very trying. Revision of membership roll, has necessitated a reduction of numbers. Nevertheless, the addition of a few from other Circuits, and several conversions, the consolidation and enlargement of our Sabbath School work, the renewed vows and more earnest service experienced in our Class and Prayer Meetings, the increased congregations, afford reason gratefully to acknowledge "Our Father's" hand in guidance and blessing through another year.

UXBRIDGE.—Peace has dwelt within our borders, and God's blessing has characterized our services. Two of our members, ripe in years, and rich in heavenly dispositions, have passed from this scene of suffering, to that of rest. The public services have been, on the whole, well attended, and the social means—prayer, class, and Bible meetings—have been well sustained, and productive of much good. Special services were held during the winter, in the village, and at Zion. Good was effected in both places, in the quickening of the Societies, and in gathering of some souls. Material improvements have been made in the church in the village, considerably increasing its capacity, and adding much to its appearance, thereby materially affecting our standing in this place.

SUTTON.—Our special meetings at Sutton, were pretty well attended, and a few professed conversion. The friends at Ravershoe, started a Sabbath School, with fair prospects. We have suffered like others, from the hard times, but our greatest need is more spirituality.

TORONTO.—In spiritual things, the past year has been our best. The financial condition of the church, which has been such a source of anxiety, hitherto, is now happily, in a good condition, so that it has admitted of more labour being bestowed by the Pastor, on the upbuilding of the church, in other ways; and the results, on the whole, are most encouraging. Notwithstanding several removals, and some unfaithfulness, our number of members is increased, and in a year of unprecedented depression,
