freedom in public prayer and speech. The blessed influences which come from a properly-conducted Prayer Meeting are also ours in our weekly meetings. The decided Christian young people who attend these meetings seek never to forget that while they are the means of strengthening Christian faith and love in our own souls, we are endeavoring to attract to our gatherings those who have not publicly confessed Christ, that we may influence them to a more open stand for righteousness. This, the great work of the Church, we hope to help forward among the young people.

Our numerical position is fairly satisfactory. There is enrolled thirty-five active members and twelve associate members.

We are about to make an attempt to do some practical work in connection with the Sunday School. We think the attendance might be increased there by an effort. Particularly would the young men of Dr. Hodge's Bible Class like to see their numbers added to. There are many members of the Congregation who could aid us in this by using their influence upon the young men of their family or acquaintance.

In conclusion, we wish to say that we look forward hopefully to the future year's work. It is God's work, and we pray for and anticipate His blessing upon it We desire that the spirit of our Society's motto, "For Christ and the Church," may touch all our Christian endeavor, and we look to our Church for their commendation and encouragement.
