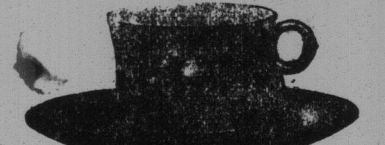

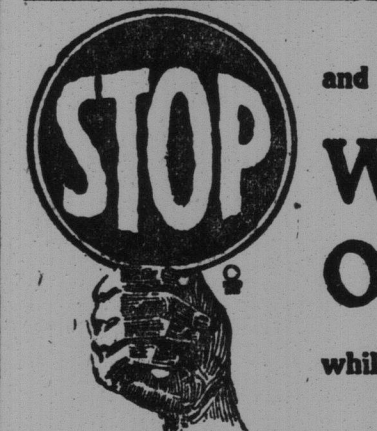

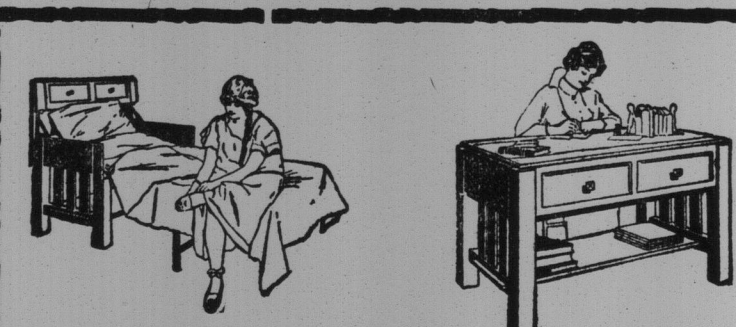

SECOND FRENCH WAR LOAN AN UNQUALIFIED SUCCESS

Paris, Oct. 29.—The closing day for subscriptions to the second war loan, notwithstanding the unfavorable weather conditions, brought out such numbers of subscribers, in Paris particularly, in quarters occupied by the laboring class, that many loan takers at the post offices and private institutions ran out of certificates, and were obliged to resort to improvised receipts for the money offered. No estimates of the total subscriptions will be possible for several days.

The only indications of the result are found in the largely increased receipts of gold at the Bank of France, and the great number of individual subscriptions received at the bank and other institutions, as compared with the first loan. The Bank of France received \$2,000,000 francs in gold during the three weeks ended October 29, as against average receipts of 6,000,000 francs a week.
