DEATHS

F. W. Blizard.

Frederick Wiggins Blizard died at his home 86 Orange street at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon at the age of 78 years. In his death the city mourns a man of high purpose, successful in his field of mercantile endeavor, and held in warm regard by all who knew him. Mr. Blizard had lived all his life in St. John, and was the son of the late Stephen G. Blizard, for many years an alderman of the city.

Frederick W. Blizard was engaged in the wholesale coal business and was president of the company which bore his name. In later years he was a director of the Consumers Coal Company, Limited.

In his youth and early manhood he was a keen athlete and throughout his life he always retained his interest in athletics. He took no active part in civic or provincial politics. The Odd-fellows organization was the only society with which he was closely connected. He was a faithful member of Centenary church.

Besides his wife, who was formerly Miss Amelia McAvity, he is survived by one son, George McAvity, of St. John; three daughters, Mrs. George N. Miller and Mrs. Wallace Alward, of Montreal, and Miss Mary, at home. Two sisters also survive. The sisters are Mrs. Joseph Bogart, of Montreal,

and Mrs. Henry Thomas, of St. John. The funeral will take place on Friday at 2.30 p.m. from his late residence.


