

ADVICE TO PARENTS GIVEN BY LORENZ

Deformities Should be Treated Early—Physician Consulted Before Going to Him—No Miracle Man, He Says.

One of the big factors in causing misunderstanding and confusion over the work of Dr. Adolf Lorenz, the Viennese orthopedic surgeon, on his present visit to New York has been the spread of a belief that he was a sort of "miracle man," despite his repeated assertions to the contrary. The circulation of such a belief is ascribed to overzealous friends of Dr. Lorenz.

Dr. Lorenz and his associates wish that these friends, instead of advertising him as a "miracle man," had undertaken a campaign of education to inform the public what kind of cases should not be taken to him. For lack of such knowledge, thousands have pressed to see him who could not be helped by him. Many have come from other cities—Toronto, Buffalo, Albany, Ossining, Newburgh, Boston, Stamford, Conn., Philadelphia, Baltimore, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Wilkes-Barre, Scranton, Erie, Pittston and Springfield, Ohio—without any appointment and with no assurance from their own physician, that Dr. Lorenz could help them. Many of them had to be referred to proper specialists in other fields of medicine and surgery.

Thousands of persons from all over the country have written asking for appointments, offering any fee Dr. Lorenz may wish to charge. One such letter was from a woman—a hopeless cripple—who saw Dr. Lorenz in Vienna in 1920 and was told there was nothing he could do for her. She returned to America. Reading of his visit, she wrote that perhaps he had discovered some new method since she saw him in 1920 and insisted that he examine her again.

Another woman came to New York one day from Long Island. Her child was also a hopeless case. Ten of the best orthopedic surgeons in New York had told her so, but she insisted on seeing Dr. Lorenz.

One woman wrote: "My baby was born without legs. Maybe you could give him legs?"

Because of these incidents Dr. Lorenz has now insisted that those who wish to see him should consult their own physicians first. This is for two reasons: First, that cases for which Dr. Lorenz can do nothing may be eliminated before seeing him; second, that when they come to him they may bring written histories of their cases, prepared by physicians in scientific terms.

Dr. Lorenz explained that all cases of paralysis were not orthopedic cases. The largest proportion probably should go to neurologists first. If a neurologist finds there is a possibility of correcting operations, the case should then be referred to an orthopedist. Children who have paralysis accompanied by lack of mental development, failure to speak, sit up or walk, are not cases to bring to Dr. Lorenz. They should be taken first to a neurologist.

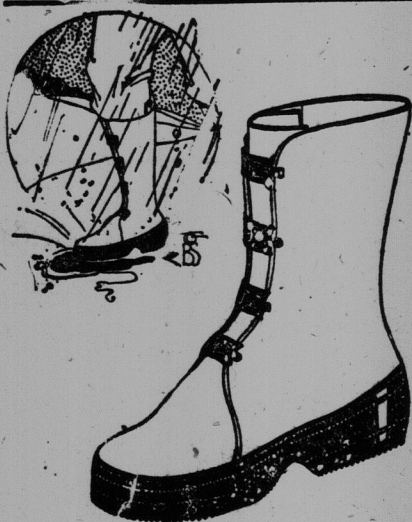

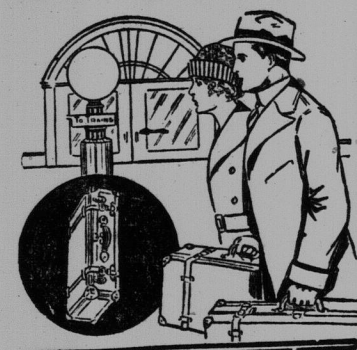
