Antwerp, Aug. 16.—The establishment of a new world's record for the javelin in which Finnish throwers won the first four places, featured the opening of the seventh Olympic contests in the stadium here yesterday.
Myrta, winner of the javelin event, added 314 metres to the record of 60.64 metres, made by E. V. Lemming of Sweden, in the Stockholm games of 1912. In addition, the next four in the event all exceeded Lemming's throw. There were no Canadian participants in the javelin event. The weather was ideal, bringing out a crowd estimated at 7,000 to the stadium.
