Others are apparently seeking to gratify ambition at the expense of the prostrate and war exhausted nations; while the near and far east seem to be seething with discontent and threatening unrest; and Russia is causing the horror of the unknown. Add to this the blind greed of the profiteers in our own and other lands, who are by adding burden to burden, goading on the peaceful and law-abiding citizens to join the forces of revolt which are indus-






The budget figures showed an increase, over last year in funds raised for parochial purposes amounted to \$349,459, being \$66,47 more than in 1918. "The need for our budget is just as great as ever," said Bishop Farthing, "and its income is not affected by the Forward Moyement. Nothing must be allowed to interfere with it. Every effort, even a greater effort than usual, must be put forth to ensure a full and liberal response. The stipends of our clergy in the diocess, in the Canadian mission field, and in a limited measure in the foreign field, will depend upon it.

Last year we were able to pay the stipends on the scale of \$1,000, \$1,100 and \$1,200 and house, through the giving of two bonuses. This year the executive committee recommend that the canonical stipends be increased to \$900, \$1,000 and \$1,100. This is instead of the bonus given last February. 


