Some I. C. R. Figures.

Ottawa, Feb. 13.—A return tabled in the commons today by Hon. Frank Cochrane on motion of Hon. Henry H. Emerson gives details of I. C. R. revenue and operating expenses during the first three months of the present fiscal year, April to June inclusive.

Revenue for three months totalled \$3,369,888, an increase of \$348,666, as compared with the corresponding period of 1912. Operating expenses totalled \$3,111,872, an increase of \$350,229. Freight transportation per ton mile cost 56 cents as compared with 50 cents in 1912.

TORIES CARRYING SPOILS SYSTEM TO EXTREMES

Legless Man Dismissed in Nova Scotia by Government—Fish Poachers as Game Wardens

Ottawa, Feb. 13.—In reply to P. B. Carvell, M. P. for Cape Breton, in the house today, Hon. Mr. Rogers said he had no recollection of having promised two wharves in Fredericton, N. B., as he had been quoted by Hon. H. P. McLeod, M. P. for York, while campaigning there in the by-election contest.

The matter of active partisanship was under discussion today, Hon. Mr. Rogers coming in for criticism from the Opposition benches because of wholesale dismissals in his department, of men appointed under the Liberal government who were charged with being "active partisans."

Mr. Rogers said that M. Bourque, light-keeper at Bourgeois River, N. B., had been dismissed after an investigation had failed to prove anything against him, and his death had been hastened by the treatment he received. Mr. Sinclair, of Guysboro, complained of Mr. Hazen being discharged from office. George Jellicott, who had been in the service some time ago, and who had managed to keep himself alive through having the position of fish warden at St. Mary's River, N. S.

Mr. Carvell said that in his country two fish poachers had been appointed to the position of fish wardens, and that instead of protecting the fish, were poaching in season and out of season.

Hon. Mr. Hazen said that the allegation was a serious one which he would have investigated, and if it was found that the men were taking fish out of season he would have them dismissed.

Mr. Kyle asked if Mr. Hazen believed the Conservatives had appointed to office should continue to act as active partisans. He did not think a government official should take an active part in partisan politics.

Mr. Kyle said that John A. MacDonald, port physician at St. Peter's, was secretary of the local Conservative organization.

Mr. Hazen said that he would have the matter investigated, and if he found the statement to be correct, he would require Mr. MacDonald to give up the secretaryship or the office he held under the department.

Hon. Mr. Hazen moved the second reading of his bill to amend the Merchants' Shipping Act. This amendment has to do with certain matters of collision, damage, salvage, etc., and is in sympathy with the findings of the International Marine Convention at Brussels, 1910.

Third reading was given to two bills by the Hon. Frank Cochrane. The first of these, respecting the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company amending the act to provide that the prairie section be completed within a time fixed by the governor-in-council.

The second, which was an act respecting the N. T. R., provided for extending the time for the completion of the prairie section by the governor-in-council.

Mr. K. Macdonald, of Halifax, another opposition speaker next raised the question of Norwegian vessels engaging in the Nova Scotia trade and charged that the government had not been true to its promises to prevent this.

The minister of marine said he had been informed the Dominion Coal Company had found these Norwegian ships, their cargo being the steel and coal produced by the company. The matter, in any case, was one for the customs department.

COAL CART AFFECTS THIS DELICATE INSTRUMENT BUT NOT EARTHQUAKE

Spokane, Wash., Feb. 13.—Since last October the seismograph at Gonzaga University in Spokane has failed to register disturbances of the earth, but it has recorded the passage of coal wagons and other heavily loaded vehicles in nearby streets. Father Adams of the faculty is overhauling the intricate mechanism.

"It is a peculiar instrument," he says, "can tell by glancing at the recording sheet when the street cars that pass near the university are two minutes late, but I can not tell when there is an earthquake. It is so sensitive that a load of coal passing here will register on the paper and if there is another earthquake it will show also. It can keep check on all the trains arriving and departing from the city by watching the instrument. It is a perfect time table, but it does not do the work that we require of it. I can find nothing wrong with the instrument and have adjusted it to a fine point of sensitivity, but there is a fault somewhere."

Ottawa, Feb. 13.—The day after the presentation of the much-heralded National Transcontinental investigating commission's report, finds little more than a ripple of interest among the members of either political party.
