AN OFFICIAL BLUNDER

London, Jan. 28—(Correspondence—Because Scotch fishermen will not go fishing on Sundays, the choice of Tuesday as London's official meatless day is declared by London fish dealers to be an official blunder. The dealers say that the public, unable to buy meat on Tuesdays, will try to make good the deficiency with fish. At this season of the year the major portion of London's fish supply comes from Scotland. For the reason that Scotch fishermen won't fish an Sundays there is no fish from Scoton Sundays there is no fish from Scot-and landed here on Mondays. The fish caught by Scotch fishermen on Monday; get here too late for London's consumption on Tuesdays.

Cornish fishermen will not catch fish on Sundays, either. They carry their scruples against Sunday labor further than do the Scotch fishermen.
