CONQUEROR OF THE HINDENBURG LINE IS DEAD

Lord Rawlinson, Under
Whom Canadians Served,
Passes Away

COMMANDED FOURTH ARMY AT AMIENS

Promotion Given in Recognition of Work Against
Germans.

DELHI, March 27.—General Lord Rawlinson, commander in chief of the British forces in India, died tonight.

Lord Rawlinson's term in India would have expired in November. His successor, General Sir William Birdwood, who has just been promoted to be Field Marshal, was named by the British War Office on March 20.

FOLLOWS OPERATION
Lord Rawlinson's death followed an operation for appendicitis on March 25.

At first it was thought that the operation was a success, as the British commander-in-chief seemed to be recovering.

General Lord Henry Seymour Rawlinson, commander-in-chief of the British forces in India, since 1920, was one of the best known British generals during the war. He was born Feb. 20, 1864, and was educated at Sandhurst, entering the army in 1884.

He was employed in the War Office on the outbreak of the war in 1914, but was given command of the Fourth Army Corps in October, 1914. He commanded the Fourth British Army Corps during the Battle of Somme, achieving important successes there and

was promoted a general in recognition of his services.

GAINED AMIENS VICTORY

On Aug. 8, 1918, his troops in conjunction with the French, attacked the enemy in the region of Amiens, and they gained a signal victory which heralded a general advance of the Allies. General Rawlinson's army played a prominent part a few weeks later in the storming of the Hindenburg line and in the subsequent victorious advance eastward.

The Canadian Corps served under Lord Rawlinson on the Somme, 1916, at Flanders, Compiette and Regina French, also at Amiens, August, 1918.

GREAT MILITARY CAREER

General Rawlinson had a great military career. He was affectionately known in the army as "Rawley." He did conspicuous service in the war, first in 1914, when he commanded the little British force, which covered the retreat from Antwerp, and again in 1916 when he carried out the first big offensive of the British in the Battle of the Somme. General Rawlinson also had charge of the great Allied advance in August, 1918, which culminated in the breaking of the famous Hindenburg Line.

HEALTH GOOD TUESDAY

General Rawlinson appeared to be in excellent health and spirits last Tuesday. He was making full plans for the future and looking forward eagerly to riding in the famous pig-sticking competition for the Kadir Cup, Tuesday evening, however, he was taken suddenly ill and was removed to a hospital and was operated on the following day for appendicitis. It is understood the body will be taken to England for burial.

REORGANIZED ARMY

General Rawlinson reorganized the Indian Army after the war and brought it to a high state of efficiency. At the same time he greatly reduced the military expenditure, thereby considerably benefiting Indian finances. He took a keen interest in the aspirations of political India to found a national army and encouraged as far as possible the formation of the same.

General Rawlinson was raised to the peerage as Baron Rawlinson. In the latter part of 1919 he was sent to North Russia to conduct the withdrawal of Allied troops from Archangel and Murmansk and on his return was commander at Alderhot for a year.

Women.

FREDERICTON, March 27.—The ladies' debating team of Dalhousie University won the intercollegiate debate here tonight from the ladies' team of the University of New Brunswick, the three judges dividing to one in favor of the visiting team.

The resolution debated was "Resolved, that the increasing tendency of women to find their sphere of activity outside the home is not in the best interests of modern society."

Dalhousie supported the affirmative and U. N. B. the negative. The judges

were Miss Bessie Wilson, of Saint John; His Lordship Bishop Richardson, of Fredericton, and Professor Liddy, of Mount Allison.

The Dalhousie team was composed of Miss Crowdis, leader; Miss Fitz-Randolphs and Miss Young. The U. N. B. team was Miss Margaret Wallace, Fredericton, leader; Miss Dorothy Bennett, Fredericton, and Miss Katherine McNaughton, Little Branch, Northumberland county.

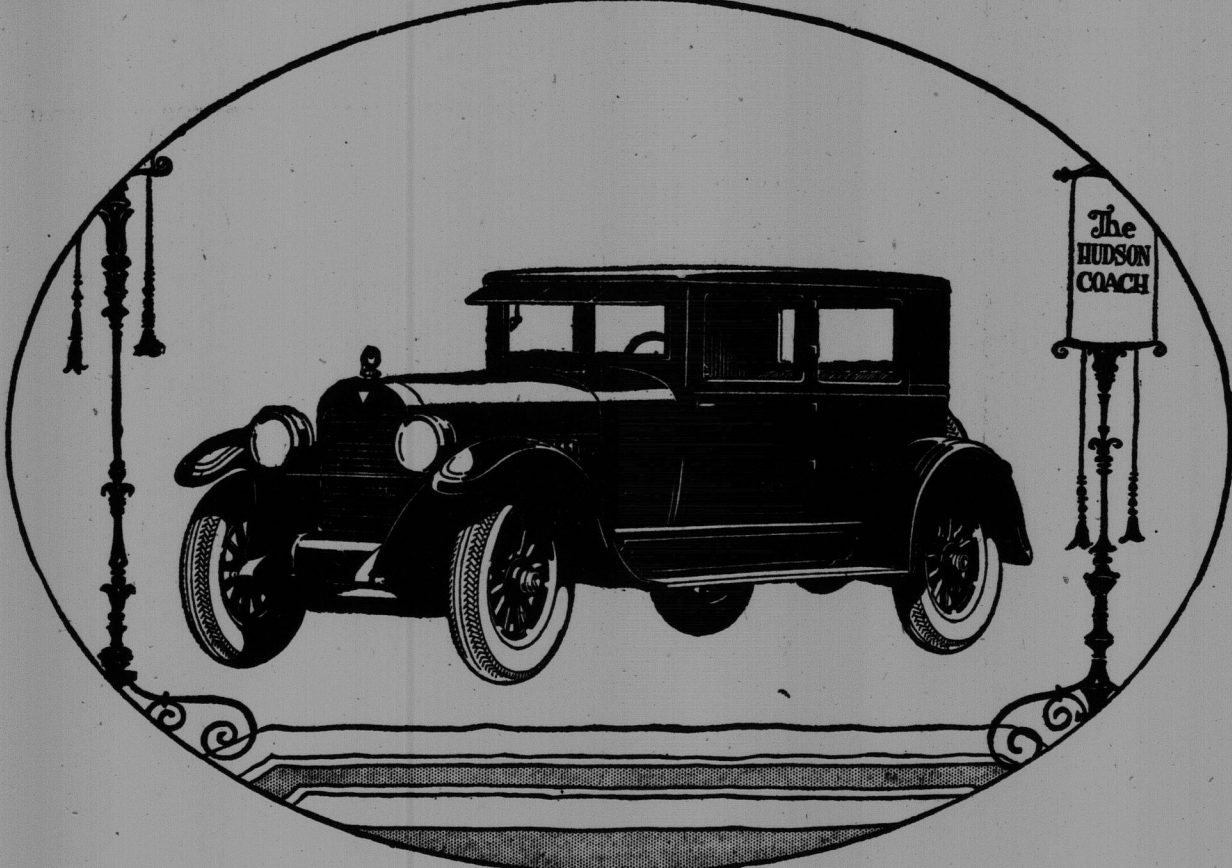
