EIGHT DIED IN SECOND BOAT OF STMR. TREVAASA

No Water and No Biscuits
Left When 16 Survivors Reached Mauritius.

Port Louis, Island of Mauritius, July 4.—The last drop of water had been drunk and the last biscuit eaten when the second lifeboat of the British steamship Trevasa arrived at this island with sixteen survivors. Twenty-four men got away in this lifeboat from the Trevasa just before she sank a month ago in the Indian Ocean, but eight of them succumbed to the hardships they were forced to endure in the small open boat.

Chief Officer Smith told of the terrible sufferings the men went through. He said that the eight men who died began drinking sea water when they could no longer withstand their thirst. They collapsed from exhaustion and the last of them died in sight of land.

The daily ration was one biscuit for each man and a few drops of water. They added to their original meagre water supply by catching rain water. When they landed the survivors, gaunt and some of them with long beards, sank to their knees and thanked God for their deliverance. Then their first request was for water. All of them had badly swollen feet, owing to constant immersion in salt water.

SANATORIUM DEDICATED BY VICTORIA OF SPAIN

Fund From Flower Fete Given to Assist Tuberculosis Patients.

Madrid, July 4.—Queen Victoria of Spain recently visited the Sanatorium of Nuestra Señora de las Mercedes, at Humera, to dedicate the new building soon to be opened for the treatment of tuberculosis patients. Proceeds from last year's Fiesta de la Flor went toward the construction of this building, and the board of the sanatorium donated the amount raised by raffling a pearl necklace.

The Queen, with the Duchess of San Carlos and the Marquis of Bendavid, was met by the Countess Romanones, president of the sanatorium board. Other members of the board, Dr. Verdes Montenegro, director of the sanatorium, and the architect, Mr. Cardenas, went with the Queen on a tour of inspection.
