

BIG GUN BLUFF

EXCITES HAMILTON

Man Made Pretence of Drawing Revolvers and Threatened Each Other Then Had Wrestling Bout.

HAMILTON, Ont., April 12.—There was a wild time in the southwestern portion of the city early yesterday morning. Alex. Findlay, it is alleged, tried to force his way into the residence of Sidney Fox, who heard him. He went outside and made a bluff as though he was drawing a revolver. The intruder did the same and the two men backed to the street, making various threats about blowing each other's head off. Findlay then ran away but Fox caught up with him a few blocks away and they had a rough and tumble struggle on the sidewalk. Findlay broke away and was closely pursued by Fox, who upon another wrestling event took place, both men's clothes being torn. Findlay finally landed Fox on the jaw and then ran away to the cricket grounds. He was finally held high and low for Friday and finally found him sneaking from the cricket grounds. He was placed under arrest on a charge of attempted murder.

TO AMALGAMATE

THREE GREAT RYS

Bill Making Progress Through British Parliament Said to be First Step in Nationalization of Railways.

LONDON, April 12.—Considerable public interest has been taken in a private bill introduced in the House of Commons recently for the amalgamation of three Great Northern, the Great Central, and the Great Eastern, representing a capital of over £125,000,000. Within parliament there has been opposition to the measure. The government through the president of the Board of Trade gave the measure some support, and Winston S. Churchill while safeguarding himself against discomfiture by declaring that the government would put no pressure on their followers, defended it so warmly that its rejection on the second reading this week would have been for himself personally a rebuff at the hands of the House of Commons. He was saved this experience when, after a debate in which not a little mistrust of his methods were expressed, the bill was ordered read a second time by a majority of twenty-five votes in a house of less than 250 members.

WHERE ARMY HORSES COME FROM

LONDON, April 12.—Of the 2507 horses bought for the army last year, 762 were purchased in Great Britain, 102 in Ireland, 58 in the colonies, 61 in Egypt and 11 in North China.

PERSIANS NOW LOOK FOR BRITISH AID

Establishment of Constitutional Government Would be of Value to Britain

Despotism Tolling—Its Triumph Would Mean Loss of British Prestige in the East.

LONDON, April 12.—The lord mayor announced, at the meeting of the Shakespeare memorial committee at the Mansion House yesterday, that a donation of \$35,000 had been promised through the Hon. Mrs. Alfred Lyttelton, by a person who wished to remain anonymous, toward the fund of \$2,500,000, said to be required for the establishment of a Shakespeare memorial theatre.

Many well known men and women were present at the meeting. The Earl of Lyttelton was there, and so was the Earl of Plymouth, Canon Hamesley attended, and there were also present Beerboom Tree, Anthony Hope, Granville Barker, Fred Kerr, Dr. F. H. Mitchell, Professor Gollance and Professor Boaz. The ladies present included the Hon. Mrs. Alfred Lyttelton, Miss Lilian Ashwell, Mrs. Ashwell and Mrs. Holman Hunt.

The meeting approved the suggestion that the Shakespeare memorial should take the form of a national theatre, and the executive committee's report was discussed in detail and approved.

A suggestion that delegates from the Headmasters' Association of the National Union of Teachers and the Working Men's Educational Association should be elected on behalf of the whole East which is associated everywhere with the idea of parliamentary government. This has an ally in England, and a friend in Turkey—two chiding exemplars to the New East. The Progressive parties in China and India are also in sympathy with the idea. A constitutional Persia would be the natural friend of England. It is in the interests of the British Empire to uphold, besides losing this inestimable advantage, Great Britain starts with a popular representation in Egypt and India.
