Prussia will remain neutral until Austria is attacked at home; and Russia aims at nothing but the humiliation of Austria. War is nessessary even in a financial point of view. It is the only means of avoiding national bankruptcy, the only decent excuse for not paying the interest on the public debt in Austria, or making a new loan in France. The war, however may be confined to Austria and France. In no case will the Emperor of France provoke a cealition."
