FREDERICTON, Feb. 20.

After dinner Mr. Keane moved for the usual disposition of the Address, and Messrs. Keane, Beveridge and Miles were appointed a committee to wait on His Excellency.

Mr. McKay introduced a bill to facilitate the construction of the Grand Scenic Railway.

Mr. Crawford, a bill relating to easements.
