JULY.—July (Latin, *Julius*), was originally called Quintilis, being the fifth month of the Roman calendar. Marc Antony designated it Julius, in honor of Caius Julius Caesar, dictator of Rome, who was born in it, and who reformed the calendar. It answers to Ab, the eleventh month of the Jewish civil year, and the fifth of their sacred year.
