Conservation meeting. The Brantford Board of Trade has called a big conference for next Friday on Grand River Conservation. Invitations have been extended to all Boards of Trade between Dunnville and Elora. The local Board will be represented. Among the local attendants will be Mr. W.H. Brethaupt who will also be among the speakers at the conference.

The Brantford people are urging efforts to secure the necessary legislation this year on the proposed conservation.

Attending Surgical Clinics. Dr. H.M. Lackner and Dr. Wallace have gone to Chicago and to Rochester, Minn., to attend Surgical Clinics. They will be absent about two weeks.

St. Thomas to Have Three Installments. The St. Thomas City Council at a special meeting instructed the City Solicitor to prepare a new by-law in respect to the collection of St. Thomas taxes, except poll and dog taxes, payable in June each year, and, if desired, may be paid in three installments, the first payment, including all business, income, school and local improvement taxes, to be paid in to the Treasury not later than June 15; one-half of the remaining general taxes to be paid in on September 15, and the other half on December 15.

Interest will be charged on all unpaid taxes. City Treasurer Perry strongly endorsed the new system, by which he felt confident the \$13,000 or more paid in interest each year by the city for advances from the banks would be cut in two. The new plan would also be favored by the majority of taxpayers, he stated, as the city has, he claimed, according to its population, more wage-earners than any other town or city in Canada, and the payment of taxes in three installments would be much easier to meet than in two.

Charged with Fortune Telling. In Stratford Police Court Mrs. Mary Lane of London was sent up for trial on a charge of fortune telling. The principal witness was Miss Lily McGregor who afterwards admitted that her name was Mary D. Wilson. She said that she asked Mrs. Lane about getting a place in the Bell Telephone office Stratford, and that Mrs. Lane advised her that she would secure a place if she applied, and that she would either get a promotion in a short time, or be married, if she started there.

Mr. W. Gowens immediately asked that the case be thrown out for lack of evidence. Mr. G.C. McPherson, however, held that the evidence of Miss McGregor was sufficient to sustain the charge. The Magistrate concurred in this opinion, saying that the whole tone of the interview was suspicious with pink lights and other "manifestations." The Magistrate committed the accused for trial at the June session, allowing her out on bail of \$1,000.

Welland's Growth. Mr. L.B. Duff, Welland's Industries Commissioner, issued a very gratifying report to-night covering the year 1918. Welland had a gain in population of 10.6 per cent., a record that was approached by only one other Ontario city and with this one exception over-approached by only one other Ontario city. This is the second year in succession that Welland has been in the position as leader of the cities of the province as revealed in the roll is \$7,638,110 an increase of more than a million dollars over the previous year. During the past twelve years it has been increased over half a million each year. More than one million and a half was spent in factory buildings and equipment, the manufactured products being valued at \$35,400,340 the pay roll exceeded six million dollars. During the year three new companies were established, and all three gave every indication of being added to the list of Welland's successful industries. The value of Welland's industrial production for the year reached a total of \$28,765,000 the output being more than ten per cent of Canada's total export for 1918. Welland was the first city in Ontario to reach its objective in the 1918 Victory Loan campaign.

J.W. WIDDIFIELD CHOICE IN NORTH ONTARIO RIDING. Toronto, Feb. 19.—J.W. Widdifield, candidate of the United Farmers of Ontario, was elected to be North Ontario seat in the Provincial Legislature to-day by a majority of 284 over Major H.S. Cameron, Government standard-bearer.

The election, which was occasioned by the death of the late Hon. W.H. Hoyle, was one of the hardest fought contests yet known in the riding, which has always been good fighting ground.

Major Harry Cameron, the Conservative candidate, is a resident of Beaverton and saw service in the trenches. He is a prominent in athletics, being at one time president of the Canadian Lacrosse Association.

His opponent, Mr. Widdifield, the candidate of the United Farmers, ran at the general election as a Liberal and was defeated by Mr.
