of war and privateers that have or may have letters of marque against France.

r. That they shall bring in for lawful adjudication, all veffels with their cargoes that are laden with goods, the produce of the French West India islands, and coming directly from any part of the faid islands to any part of Europe:

2. That they shall bring in for lawful adjudication, all thips with their cargoes that are laden with goods, the produce of the faid islands, the property of which goods shall belong to subjects of France, to what foever ports they may be bound.

3. That they shall feize all ships, that shall be found attempting to enter any port of the said islands that is, or shall be blockaded by the arms of his majesty or his allies; and shall send them in with their cargoes for adjudication, according to the terms of the second article of the former instructions bearing date Sth of June, 1793.

4. That they fhall feize all veffels laden wholly or in part with naval or military flores, bound to any port of the faid iffands, and fhall fend them into fome convenient port belonging to his majefly, in order that they, together with their cargoes, may be proceeded against according to the rules of the law of nations.
