



The degrees of control extends to recommndation to the University authorities of expulsion.

Responsibility for discipline is in the hands of a Judicial Committee, composed of students. Provisions are made for speedy trials, which hear all cases first. If either prosecutor, defendant or the Court asks for a Full Court trial it is held. The Full Court acts as "a judge and sentencing body."

It has the power to impose fines up to \$5, and impose such penalties as the court may see fit. Appeal may be made from the Full Court to the Student's Council, only at the request of the defendant.


