## No for CLC

KINGSTON (CUP) — The outer council of the Queen's University Ala Mater Society (MS) decided not to support the Canadian Labour Congress (CLC) day of protest at its meeting September 23.

In passing a motion calling fro opporition to the October 14 action, the AMS joined student unions at the Universities of Alberta and Toronto in contradiction of the National Union of Students (NUS) position of total support for the day.

Opposing the motion, councillor Ross Sutherland poined how closely aligned the Liberal government is with the interests of big business.

The only effective means of protest against the combined powers of industrialists and the Liberal party is something unconventional like the illegal general strike, Sutherland said. He went on to suggest that what is legal is not necessarily just.

AMS president Jamie Avis supported the motion, saying, "I don't think we have an extreme enough situation to justify such a radical for of protest." This is not one of the times students can identify with labor, he said.
