This is the third time we have been at york for a Deed, and that in consequence of Sir John Johnston's informing us that the Deed was ready to be signed by your Excellency which would be some on your arrival here, we therefore request that your Excellency will have the goodness to sign the Deed and order it to be delivered to us that we
