Dominion of Canada, Province of British Columbia, County of Vancouver, to wit:

IN THE MATTER of the mob attack upon the Chinese business section of the City of Vancouver, made on the evenings of the 7th and 8th days of September, 1907, commonly known as the Anti-Asiatic Riots:

- I, He Cow, of the City of Vancouver, in the Province of British Columbia, do solemnly declare:—
- (1) That I am a member of the firm of

 Merchant Tailors,

 by trade, carrying on business

at 43, Pender street, in the City of Vancouver.

- (2) That the windows of the said place of business were broken by the said mob of rioters on the September instant.
- (3) That annexed hereto is a correct estimate of the amount (\$) necessary to repair said breakages.
- And I make this declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath, by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act.
