"MY MR. MACGREGOR:

Q. You will note, Mr. Scammell that this
letter of July 31, 1926, of Hon. W.A. Black,
does not suggest that the services of neither
Dr. O.G. Donovan nor Dr. Mann be dispensed with
before September 30, 1926? A. Yes.
