
Ottawa, January 30, 1907.

Dear Sir:

In connection with previous correspondence relative to the Louis Bull day school, I beg to say that from a late report received by the Department it would appear that this school is doing no good under the present teacher and the Indian Commissioner recommends that your attention should be called to the unsatisfactory condition existing there and that the school be closed unless an energetic teacher can be secured for it.

The last communication received from you on this subject was dated February 13, 1906, in which you mentioned that you were writing to the Chairman of the District and would report the facts to the Department for such action as may be deemed advisable. Since that date no further communication has been received from you, and the Department would like to know what action, if any, your Society is prepared to take with a view to bettering the state of affairs at this school, as it would appear to be useless to carry it on under the present conditions.
