I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 15th instant, with reference to Pearl Sands, William Jacobs and Solomon Jacobs pupils of the Mount Elgin Industribute and note the excuses which they give for not reting to school.

In reply I beg to say that the Department desire have these pupils returned immediately to the school. The Department requests you immediately to lay an information against these pupils before the most convenient magistrate of the county, who will issue his warrant to a county consdirecting the constable to search for, apprehend and take these pupils back to the school. I am enclosing the necessions in each case.

As you are aware the returning of these pupils the school has been delayed for an unreasonable time. The Department depends upon you to give every assistance to to officers employed in executing these warrants and if these pupils are not returned immediately some explanation will required.

I am enclosing also a copy of the Regulations relating to the Education of Indian Children.
