I beg to enclose herein a copy of a statement which has been received from Chief Wm. E. S. Dudoard in reply to the notice which you served on him on the 20th ultimo, with reference to the McMillan property. I am also enclosing a reply to Chief Dudoard which you will be good enough to forward to him.

Before taking any action to effect this sale, the Department would be glad to know whether Chief McMillan ever intended to sell his interest in this property to Dudoard, and if so what you consider would be the value of his half interest as the property stood before Dudoard went into possession.

You will note the Chief's statement that he spent a sum of \$600.00 in improvements on this property since taking possession. Would you be good enough to look over the property and state what amount of improvements you consider have been put on this property.
