## WEDNESDAY-Afternoon Session.

Synod re-assembled at 2 P.M.

The Lay Secretary read the Report of the Special Committee on Credentials.

Moved by the Committee, seconded by Rev. T. W. Johnston, that it be adopted.

The Clerical Secretary reported the number of clergy qualified to vote as 96. Of this number 88 were present this morning.

The Lay Secretary reported 138 Laymen qualified to vote, of whom 98 were present to-day, other representatives coming in after the roll was called increased the number to 104.

This being a special session the minutes of the last session were not read.

The Archdeacon of N. S., Chairman, then read his opening address.
