Sealed proposals will be received by the Council of the Town of Niagara Falls, Canada, until 8 o'clock p. m. the 6TH DAY OF JULY, 1903, for the furnishing of all the material and performing all the work necessary for the complete construction of Sections Nos. 1 and 2 of the Niagara Falls Paving System.

Section 1—7000 sq. yards more or less of vitrified brick pavement on concrete foundation.

Section 2—3100 sq. yards more or less of vitrified brick pavement on concrete foundation. Proposals are to be in bulk for each section and each proposal shall be accompanied by a certified cheque on some chartered Bank of Canada for an amount equal to ten per cent. (10%) of the bidder's price, payable to the Treasurer of the Town of Niagara Falls, said cheque to be returned to the person making the proposal unless he fail to execute the contract according to the specifications should it be awarded to him.
