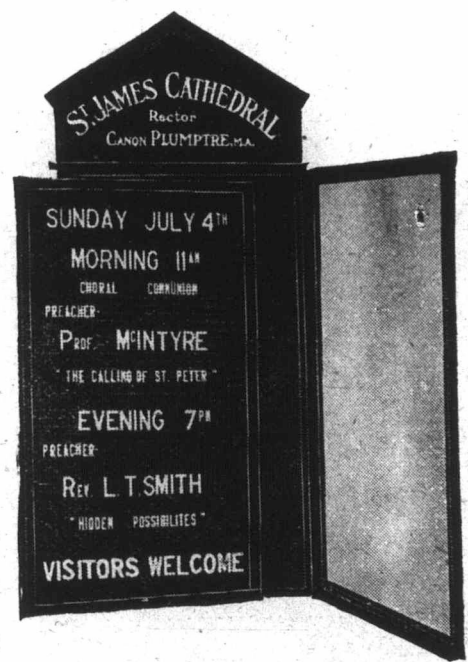

Individual metal letters—clean sharp white letters on black background—are set up on bars in any arrangement desired.

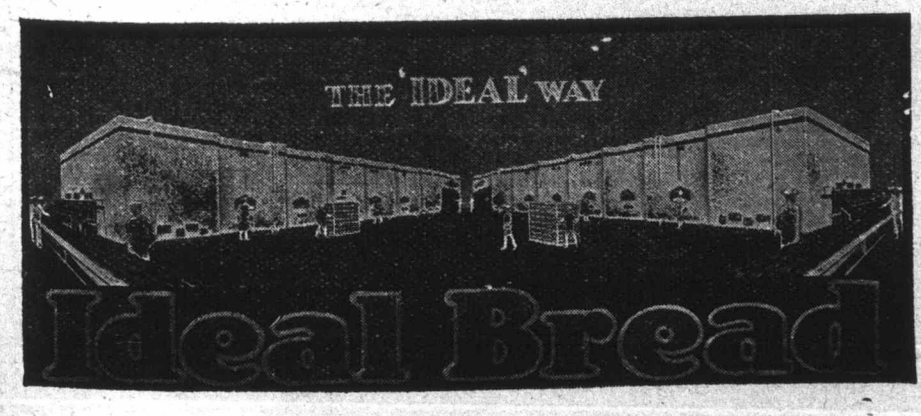
