## Tuesday, October 24, 1769.

Mr. Salter, from the Committee apointed to examine the Public Accounts, reported the proceedings of the faid Committee therein, and the House having taken the faid Report into Confideration, came to the following Resolutions:

Report of the Come mirtee appointed to Examine the Public Accounts.

Refolv'd, That it appears to this House, that the Refolutions there-Sum of f. 70. 1. 2. is due from Benoni Danks, Esq; Collector of the Duties of Impost and Excise at Cumberland, exclusive of Four Notes of Hand from different Persons, amounting to £43. 3. 3. transmitted by him to the Treasury as Payments, but which still remain unpaid, and that the faid Benoni Danks, has not served render any Account for Duties collected fince the 30th April last; that there likewife appears to be due by Mr. Samuel Wethered, of Cumberland, the Sum of £89. 14. for Duties of Impost and Excise and License Money.

Refolv'd, That it appears to this House, that by the Accounts of George Cottnam, Efq; Collector of the Duties of Impost and Excise at Louisbourg, to February 1768, there has been collected there the Sum of £201. 7 of which there has been paid into the Treasury only Lgo. which, with the charge of £40. for Commissions, £40 for a Waiter and Guager, and £19. 0. 6 1 for fundry
