Business at the Union Yards for cattle esterday was good and active for procically all classes of batcher heifers and good 25c higher on this class of cattle. Therun was light, hardly enough coming to make a real good trade, but what

there was sold good. All other classes were steady to strong-The lamb trade, with a fair run of 2500 sheep and lambs, started out steady on the lambs, a few of them selling at \$13, but the market soon weakened off, selling down to \$11.50 before it reached bottom, and closing weak. Bad reports from Chicago and Buffalo, and app ehension as to what the threatened cmbargo may do is having its effect From \$5 to \$6 per cwt were offered for good quality sheep

The calf market is wrak, the bulk of the sales running from \$14 to \$15, and they have to be good to bring \$16. Quotations were steady on hogs; but peculation is rife as to the course of the market for the week The buyers for the big plants are not sending out any price yet.
