



### MEETING OF WATER COMMISSIONERS

The regular monthly meeting of the city water commissioners was held in the City hall on Thursday Messrs. John Fair, chairman, and A. G. Montgomery

The most important item o. Just ness transacted was the passing of a motion introduced by Mr. A. G. Montgomery to the effect that the commission should communicate with the Pittsburg Filter Manufacturing Company and some other similar concerns with the view of having their representatives inspect the waterworks system and equipment and to report on the conditions and expense of installing a modern filtering plant necessary to meet all the demands of the city for several years. The expense involved in the above action to be borne by the company conducting the examination. Should the report be favorable it was proposed to submit a by-law to the ratepayers on the occasion of the January elections. The same motion provided for securing an outside ex-\*\*\* sulting Engineer to inspect the surrounding of the waterworks and report on the best source to attain a permanent and efficient supply o water sufficient to meet all the requirements for years to come. The secretary was instructed to report to the board what the cost of such man would be.
