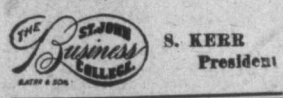

**North Mountain Railway  
Has Visitation**

On Tuesday of last week a  
large delegation from Kentville  
were guests of General Manager  
Graham on a run over the new  
North Mountain Railway  
branch of the D. A. R.

The party consisted of Mr.  
Graham, Mr. R. U. Parker Hal-  
ifax, Mr. A. E. Chesley, Mr.  
Commeau, General Freight  
agent all of the D. A. R. Mayor  
Yould, and members of the Kent-  
ville Town Council President  
Blair and members of the coun-  
cil of the Board of Trade.

The party left Kentville, at  
noon on the regular western  
train and lunch was served soon  
after departure. At different sta-  
tions the following joined the  
party each bringing a bountiful  
display of apples, pears etc. J. A.  
Kinsman, Blake Clarke, Harry  
and Thomas Clarke etc.

Although the day was stormy  
one the country all along the  
line showed how great an agri-  
cultural and fruit district this  
branch line was serving. The  
farmers who joined the tour  
were able to tell of the crops  
raised on different farms and  
compare the time now taken in  
getting their produce to the rail-  
way with the time when it took  
them nearly all winter to haul  
their fruit and potatoes from 4  
to 6 miles to the main line. The  
warehouses along the line, were  
filled and busy and our train on  
its return had twelve cars filled  
with fruit, on its arrival at cen-  
terville.

Everyone was astonished with  
the fine farming district along the  
line and the great feeder this  
branch will be to the main line.

A hearty vote of thanks and  
cheers were given Mr. Graham,  
for giving so many an oppor-  
tunity to look over this part of  
our county Mr. Graham in re-  
sponding hoped all would do  
their utmost to promote produc-  
tion so that such an expensive  
branch railway would not only  
prove profitable to the D. A. R.,  
but help in the necessary produc-  
tion of the Empire.
