CONVENTION RESOLUTION

The Work of the Day is Set Forth in the Various **Motions Submitted** and Passed

What the Liberals did at Their Meeting in Toronto-Their Temperance Platform

Lieut.-Col. Munro and Major White of Woodstock, moved this resolution, without comment, and it was carried unanimously: "That in the development of New Ontario it is of primary importance that active measures should be adopted for the setures should be adopted for the set-tlement of its agricultural lands by judicious selection of the best class of immigrants from the old world, and by directing from the older coun-ties of the Province those who might otherwise settle in other Provinces or in the United States; and as all movements of population either with-in the Province or from abroad to the Province, unless carefully con-trolled, may injuriously affect the laboring classes, and disturb the balires should be adopted for the setlaboring classes, and disturb the bal-ance between the supply and demand for labor, skilled or unskilled, this convention would recommend the apconvention would recommend the appointment of a Minister to be known as a Minister of Colonization and Labor, to whose department should be attached the immigration and colonization branches of the Government, and also the Bureau of Labor, factory inspection, and any other branches of a kindred character that may hereafter be established."

Public Ownership Reseation.

"That it has been the policy of the Legislative Assembly under the direction of the Liberal party to give the greatest: liberty consistent with safety to municipalities in regard to all matters of a local or municipal character.

"That for over half a century the municipalities of Ontario have had the right of ownership in toll roads and bridges constructed for the use of the municipalities, and during re-

of the municipalities, and during reor the municipanties, and during re-cent years, under Liberal legislation, a similar right has been conferred with regard to such public utilities as water, heat, gas, electric light and power, telephone, street rail-ways, public parks, libraries, etc.

That where these utilities were in the hands of private companies or corporations power was given to municipalities to take them over and operate them for the municipalities

operate them for the municipalities and the ratepayers.

"That in 1902 provision was made whereby any municipality, either by itself or in union with other municipalities, could lease or own franchise of waterpowers for generating and transmitting electricity, and a committee, of several municipalities is mittee of several municipalities is now considering how this power may best be exercised in connection with the generation of electricity in Western Ontario in connection with

Niagara Falls.
"That the Government obtained authority from the Legislative Assembly to construct at the expense of the public treasury the Temiskaming. & Northern Ontario Railway for the purpose of opening up the northern districts of the Province, which rail-way is now owned by the Province. "That this convention, while ap-

rhat this convention, while approving of the legislation so adopted, desires to express the opinion that any difficulty which experience has shown to stand in the way of ownership by municipalities of any franchise which a majority of the ratemyers in that he half dequasified ratepayers in that behalf de-clare to be in the public interest should be removed (due regard being had to the private interests invol-ved), and that all franchises for any public service of any kind whatso-ever hereafter granted by a munici-pality shall be limited to a period not exceeding 30 years, with the right of purchase at any time within that period on such equitable terms as a properly constituted Board of Arbitrators might determine.

Charters For Big Cities. Frequent demands having been made in the past by the City of To-ronto for a special charter, and the Government having intimated during the past two sessions its willingness to grant a special charter to the City of Toronto, this convention ap-City of Toronto, this convention approves of this action and of a similar course in the case of any city where geographical conditions or other circumstances would warrant the same."

The resolution was carried. Liberal Temperance Platform. The following is the temperance resolution adopted by the Liberal convention:

That this convention desires to

That this convention desires to place on record its unqualified conviction that intemperance is an evil with which there should be no compromise; that the temperance sentiment of the community, as evidenced by votes taken from time to time, has shown that the people are prepared for advanced legislation. And without reciting numerous amendments to the License Act, on which there should be no difference of opinion, this convention declares that any legislation which affords a well-grounded hope of being effective in curtailing and restraining the treating habit, in reducing the consumption of intoxicating liquors, in closing drinking resorts, and in preventing the sale of liquors on Sundays and during prohibited hours, and the most vigorous enforcement of the license law in every particular would meet with its approval, as in the interests of public morals, the domestic comfort and the material wealth of the people of Ontarie.
