## In the Realms of Sport

### ST. JOSEPH'S REGATTA & GARDEN PARTY.

Closely Contested Races Feature Programme.

St. Joseph's Annual Garden Party and Regatta took place at Quill's Lake yesterday afternoon, and although the weather was not all that could be desired, citizens of all classes and creeds were present, thus fully demonstrating the keen interest taken in aquatic sports. In the morning it looked as though the event would have to be postponed. The rain poured steadily for several hours, but when the weather cleared by noon it was decided to hold the day's sports.

Shortly after 2 p.m. hundreds of citizens wended their way to the Lakeside, but just before the first race was about to start, a heavy shower came down, and everyone scattered for cover, whilst probably thousands of people who were already on their way to the course, returned home again disappointed. The rain storm soon passed over, and ere long the sun shone out and the weather remained fine for the greater part of the afternoon. A strong wind from the Northward made conditions on the pond unpleasant for the oarsmen, particularly at the buoys, where there was quite a lot, hence the time in all races was slow compared with that of Regatta Day. Nevertheless the races were well contested and many of the "wise ones" received a slipping up in the betting. The programme of events and winners are as follows:

### AMATEUR

The crews lined up at the stakes, viz: Nellie R. (Howlett's) Cadet (Tobin's); and Guard (Feldman's). The race down the pond was very evenly contested, but upon turning the buoys the Guard secured a good turn and came away about half a boat's length in advance of the Cadet, with the Nellie R. three lengths to the rear. The positions remained practically unchanged up the pond. The Guard crossed over first about two lengths ahead of the Cadet, with Howlett's crew several lengths in the rear. Time 10.32.

### ALL STAR RACE.

The participating crews in this race were the Truckmen who won the Governor's Cup on Regatta Day, rowing the Nellie R., Blackhead in the Cadet, and Portugal Cove in the Guard.

The Nellie R. took the lead from the start, and gaining a substantial lead, finished several boat lengths ahead. Blackhead and Portugal Cove rowed a very even race for second place. Time 10.34 1-5.

### SENIOR FOOTBALL RACE.

Only three crews entered for this race. The C.C.C. in the Cadet did not

The Committee then went to the marquee tent, where the prizes were presented to the winners. Rev. Fr. Pippy made the presentation, and congratulated the winning oarsmen on their prowess. Following the presentation, Rev. Fr. Pippy, on behalf of the Parish, thanked the Committee for their work which they had accomplished so successfully, the crews for taking part, which made the day so enjoyable, and all those who worked so unselfishly for the Parish.

### THE DANCE.

The two leading crews put up a stubborn race to the winning post, and found the Cadet first, six strokes in advance of the Guard, second.
