Thomas Lynn Bristowe, Conservative
M. P. for Norwood, England, is dead. Mr. Bristowe was about 58 years old, and known as a prominent dealer in foreign stocks. He was also a captain in the First Rifles.

Thirteen-year-old Albert Wagner, New-
ark, N. J., was drowned in Lot's Lake Sunday. He made no outcry, and was missing minutes before his absence became known. Heart disease is believed to have stricken him.

WRECKED ON THE ISLE OF JERSEY.
Excursionists Badly Scared and Im-

prisoned by the Island of Jersey, in the English Channel, and loaded with excursionists, has been wrecked in a fog at La Passee Point, on the island. When the passengers were rescued, they were found to be in a state of panic. One of them had no chance of escape. One of them rushed to the captain and offered him a gold watch in return for his life. Scores of women fell on their knees and begged heaven for mercy. One young woman who had evidently come to the island for a holiday, confessed her husband's infidelity and cried that if heaven only spared her life she would never do so again.

THE FRANTIC PEOPLE RUSHED LITTER
and seized the belts and clambering crew were helpless to get the lifeboats in working order. Fortunately the Alert did not go down, but held together, although the wrecked and fishermen put out in their boats to save the people. By the time they got to the Alert several passengers were attempting to jump from the steamer into the water, while the crew were making every effort to hold them back. Exactly why they should want to jump was difficult to understand, as they were perfectly safe for the time on board and would probably have been rescued by the lifeboats.
