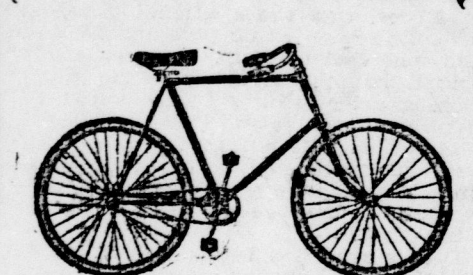

DEATH OF MRS. R. C. STRUTHERS'
FATHER.
The Chatham Planet says: "Joseph
Wallace, who, at the patriarchal age
of 85, departed this life, was a na-
tive of County Cork, Ireland, and came

county, on the homestead at Louisville,

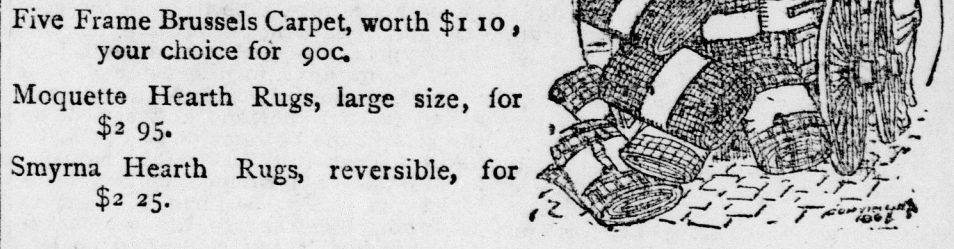
