

Orangemen and Unionists Will Hold a Rival Meeting-Heated Protest From Churchmen.

London, Feb. 1. - The rival camps in Belfast are awaiting Feb. 8 with anxious expectancy.

"Churchill for Paradise" is today's ironical headline on Belfast newspaper bills. "Paradise" is the name of the playing field of the Celtic football club. A tent which will accommodate 4,000 people is being erected Mr. Winston Churchill, having been

As a countermove, the Unionist Council is issuing circulars to the Orange lodges and Unionist clubs throughout Ulster. summoning the local Orangemen to for a simultaneous anti-Churchill demonstration at the Northeast agricultural show grounds in Bel-


