LOSS OFF BASIS

son, we would find that they had probably been in the merchant's cellar for a long time and that a number of them were bad.

"It has been by educating the public that the egg business has been placed where it is today. A few years ago people would not think of eating eggs in the summer months, but now eggs are disposed of all the year around, and the quality must be kept up in order to keep the business up. If you break an egg at breakfast today, and find it rotten, you probably won't desire another egg for six weeks. The buyers have been standing the egg losses in the past, but now they are going to put it up to the seller. Under the arrangement, the man, whether he be producer or middleman, who sells the eggs, will take the loss that results from the discovery of any number of bad ones in a consignment."

Some Startling Figures.

Great changes have taken place in the egg business within the last few years. In 1902, it was pointed out at yesterday's meeting, 11,835,064 dozen eggs were exported from Canada. At that time the dealers hardly gave a thought to the local market. But in 1913, according to the Government records, the Canadian importation of eggs was 12,440,111 dozen. It is estimated that the people of Canada consume 14,000,000 dozens of eggs in one year, this being due to the increased population and to the growing public taste for the commodity. A per capita consumption of 13.72 dozen per year has been increased, the experts say, in ten years' time to 17.39 dozen.

The live stock branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture was investigating for some months in an investigation of the Canadian egg trade, and it was found that the people of the Dominion were very heavy egg eaters.

In 1891, according to the Government figures, the population was 4,332,239 and the total egg production, 64,493,241 dozen. In 1911, the population had risen to 7,204,435 and the egg production to 123,062,332 dozen. In that time, exports dropped from 8,002,935 dozen to 32,164 dozen, and imports jumped from 602,533 dozen to 2,378,640 dozen.

Eggs Dearer in Canada.

An interesting point that was brought out at the meeting of the buyers here yesterday, was that the price of eggs in Canada is three cents per dozen dearer in Canada than in the United States. In New York it was stated, eggs were being sold wholesale for 15 cents against 12 cents in London, from which it would appear that the United States farmers are going in for egg-production to a far greater extent than are the farmers of Canada. Before the revision of the United States tariff, five cents per dozen was charged on all eggs shipped into the country, but now they go in free.

The Canadian Government experts who investigated the situation, advance a number of reasons for the shortage of eggs in this country. From the time that mixed farming became general in the Central states, they say, the United States egg crop has been able to keep pace with the demand, and heretofore, when there was a shortage in Canada, eggs have been available on the Chicago and other large western markets. More lately, however, increased consumption on the part of the Americans and through a slightly smaller egg crop, the surplus has not been available. In recent years,

the experts point out, the Canadian storage crop was sufficient to meet the demand until the middle of December or a little later, but after that American eggs were imported to supply the shortage.

In the years that have passed, it was the custom of the Ontario buyers to ship large quantities of eggs to the Northwest, but A. E. Silverwood states that this market is practically exhausted owing to the growing disposition of western farmers to produce their own eggs. The Ontario dealers must therefore look to the local markets and to some export business, for a disposal of their goods.

Great Loss in Bad Eggs.

W. J. Ault, of the Department of Agriculture, went into the question with buyers at the London conference, and in the discussion which followed it was pointed out that the loss to Canadian farmers, merchants and dealers, from bad eggs, had, in one year, amounted to nearly four million dollars. This, it was declared, called for a very determined stand by the buyers in keeping up the quality, and the loss-off method of purchasing was considered the best remedy for the evil. By means of this plan, the buyers will be safeguarded, the public will be safeguarded, and the producers themselves will be benefited, the latter through the ever-increasing consumption of eggs following the duction of the public to the fact that the eggs it purchases are to be relied upon.

W. A. Brown, B. S. A., in an address at the last Provincial winter fair, in Guelph, made several interesting points with regard to the egg situation in Canada.

Canadian Eggs Lack Quality.

"Another point and one that should not be overlooked before dwelling upon the great opportunity that exists for the Canadian producer at the present time," said Mr. Brown, "is the fact that Canadian eggs as marketed at the period of high production by the buyers in keeping up the quality that one would expect. From information that is in the possession of the live stock branch, it is estimated that in the summer time not more than 33 per cent of the eggs received in the large markets grade select. About 40 per cent grade standard, approximately 17 per cent, very stale, 5 per cent dirty and broken and 5 per cent bad. Some dealers state that as high as 10 to 15 per cent of their eggs prove, upon examination, to be wholly unfit for food. This is a feature that these who criticize the high prices do not seem to have taken into consideration."

Farmers' Golden Opportunity.

"In conclusion it is evident that the most salient feature of the whole question is the golden opportunity for the farmers and others to increase their poultry plants and take advantage of the high prices prevailing for poultry and poultry products. Every farmer should keep at least one hundred hens. The amount of labor entailed is not great, and with reasonable success, the revenue obtainable therefrom, in proportion to capital invested, is greater and more readily available than from any other branch of farm work."

DISASTROUS FIRE AT ST. AUGUSTINE, FLA.

Five Hotels, Court House and Houses Destroyed—Damage Over \$500,000.

St. Augustine, Fla., April 2.—Fire early today destroyed five tourist hotels, the county court house and a number of residences here. It is thought no lives were lost, though many guests at the Florida, Atlantic, Central and Claremont hotels, which were destroyed, escaped scantily clad and had no time to save their personal belongings.

The flames were checked late this forenoon. The property damage is estimated at \$500,000 to \$750,000.

MURDER TRIAL IS STOPPED BY JUDGE; PRISONER RELEASED

English Court Severely Censures Coroner For Inquest.

THE PROSECUTION AGREES

When Starchfield Is Freed Is Greeted With Wild Cheers By Dense Crowd.

New York, April 2.—A cable to the Tribune from London says: There was a dramatic ending yesterday to the trial of Starchfield, charged with the murder of his young son, Willie Starchfield, whose body was found in a train on the North London Railway on January 8. The judge stopped the trial before the prosecution had completed its case, and bluntly asked the crown counsel whether the case could safely be allowed to go to the jury. The end was swift and startling, even to those who have had great experience in murder trials. As the acquitted man emerged from the court house he was greeted with wild cheers. The crowd was so dense that he had to take refuge in a shop.

From both sides during the trial came scathing comments regarding the coroner's inquest. The judge was even severer than the counsel. "The manner in which the inquest was conducted," he said, "violated all the principles under which any such inquiry should be carried out. It was an entire mockery and abuse of the duties intrusted to a coroner."

SERIOUS ACCIDENT DUE TO HERD OF BUFFALO

Twenty Java Natives Killed—Fifty Injured When Train Strikes Animals.

Batavia, Java, April 2.—Twenty natives were killed and fifty others injured today by the derailment of a train which was crossing a bridge near Tanjong Priok, about six miles from this city. The accident was caused by a herd of Buffalo into which the locomotive ran.

A number of Europeans travelling on the train escaped injury, as they occupied the rear cars.

GOVERNOR M'ARTHUR IS DEAD AT SARNIA

Never Recovered After Operation for Appendicitis—System Was Poisoned.

Sarnia, April 1.—Robert Gibson McArthur, aged 66, and for the past 21 years governor of the local county jail, died at the governor's house today after an illness of about seven weeks. He was taken ill with appendicitis and was removed to the General Hospital and operated on. He never recovered, poison going through his system. He has been at his home for the past three weeks.

Deceased was born near the Village of Caledonia and moved when a young man to the Village of Thorndale, twenty-two years ago he moved to Forest, and one year later was appointed governor of the county jail.

He was a prominent Liberal and a Presbyterian.

Besides his wife he is survived by one daughter, Isabel, at home, and two sisters, Miss Margaret McArthur, of Claremont, Ont., and Mrs. Robert Cowie, of East Williams, near Stratford.

The funeral will be held on Friday afternoon at 12:30 to the Grand Trunk depot, and interment will be made at Theodora.

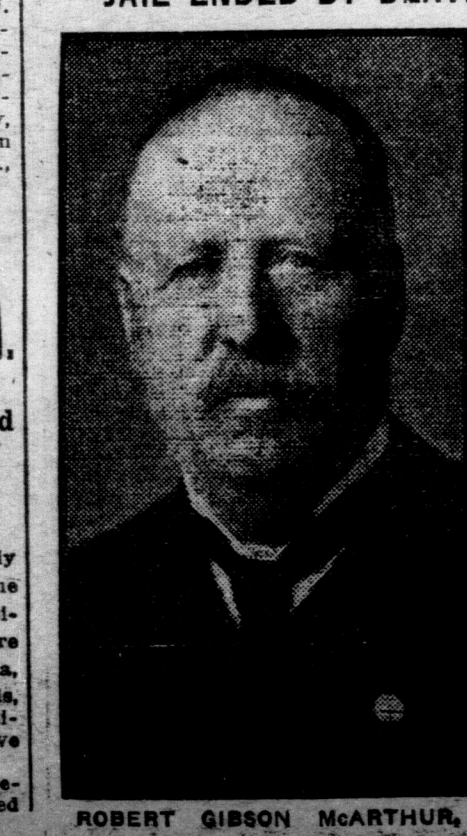
"THE BEACON CITY" IS SARNIA'S CHOSEN NAME

So He Informs Congress in Message—Ready for Sacrifice.

Mexico City, April 1.—"Before leaving these precincts I must engrave upon your hearts that it is my purpose, as I have said before to the national congress, to achieve the peace of the country, and, if to do so your sacrifice and mine shall be indispensable, you and I will know how to sacrifice ourselves. This is my purpose, or what is the same thing, my profession of political faith."

With this statement Provisional President Huerta ended his message to Congress, which convened tonight. The document otherwise was devoid of sensational statements or dramatic effect.
