Dr. Coleman had told the committee, it was stated, that he had understood that medical men were limited to 100 quart prescriptions in a month, but were not limited in the number of six-ounce and eight-ounce prescriptions. The committee found that Dr. Coleman had not exceeded the limit so far as 100-quart prescriptions were concerned. were concerned.
