Ottawa, Dec. 2.—An additional order for 15,000 tons of Canadian hay to be shipped to South Africa during February was received by the Department of Agriculture today. This will make 160,500 tons sent from Canada to South Africa since the outbreak of the war. Washington, D. C., Dec. 2.—The opening day of the first session of the 57th corrowed galleries.
