The whole town covers perhaps 30 or 40 acres. The principal building is the hotel, which worthily blocks the end of the main street. It is a bare and ricketyooking structure, but represents the acme of luxury at Cettinje. The other public places are the prison, the church and the school. The first of these lies on the right hand side and in front of the gates, or a lawn. The prisoners amuse themselves by playing various rude games—bowls, with pieces of rock for balls, leap frog and so on. A few of them Of Pure Cod Liver Oil and

are engaged in odd building jobs about Cettinje, and others hew wood in the mountain. They are not chained, but appear seldom to dream of running away. When a case of evasion happens, one or two fellow convicts are dispatched to catch the runaway and bring him back a thief is here practised most literally and methodically. 
