THE CHURCH OF THE WALDENSES IN THE PIEDMONT-ESE VALLEYS.

If the hundle church, which I have the happiness to represent, date make us feethe voice heard in the midst of you, dearly beloved brethren, I must first of all implore your indulgence for it.

That church was boun, it bred, it suffered, and its mins still semala amongst the tocke whence flow those waters which lentifice a large and heatalso part of Iray; and yet it is but yesterday that Italy represel it, the many costs ago a great Pinnee—sone who will always hold a high plare in noise and generous latina minds—sillowed it to be proclaimed in the same, divit the church of the Waldenes was a thorn in like heart of his shommons. This same moment hook care, it is true, to give a very interesting commentary on these words, in the premible of the edict of the 17th February, 1813, for the emancipation of the Waldenes, when he declared that the goad conduct and the virtues of this portion of his subjects rendered them worthy of such a favour.
