The passage of this bill will permit the City Council, if they think fit, to take effective steps for the erection of Exhibition Buildings, and thus enable the City to secure the Prize Fund of four thousand dollars provided by the statute, and annually voted by the Legislature, which during the last three successive years has been enjoyed by other localities.

Both at Truro and Kentville a large surplus fund remained, after paying all the Exhibition expenses, and, with the much larger amount of admission fees that may be expected in the City of Halifax, a Provincial Exhibition, if judiciously managed, ought to prove a financial success, besides conferring incalculable benefit upon trade and industry.

Annapolis Royal Agricultural So-CIETY .-- The regular quarterly meeting of the Annapolis Royal Agricultural Society is announced, to make the necessary preparation for holding an exhibition in the autumn, at which all the Societies in the County are invited to join. A special invitation is extended to those engaged in industrial pursuits, to attend this meeting. Now, this is a new departure, and we hope the industries of the County will be well represented. Upon payment of one dollar, any person may become a member, in which case he is entitled to compete for prizes .- Annapolis Journal.
