To Editor of Church Chronicle.

REV. AND DEAR SIR,—At the last meeting of the Synod a committee was appointed by the Bishop in accordance with the following resolution:—Moved by S. B. Harman, Esq., seconded by Col. Armstrong, that a select committee of 15 members be appointed to consider the report and bill submitted to this Synod, and report at the next session of this Synod, and if they report in favor of the incorporation of the Synod and Church Society, that they shall report a bill for that purpose, which shall stand first in the order of the day after routine business.

My present object is to call attention to the fact, that although the period for the re-assembling of Synod is drawing near this committee has not yet been called together.

The subject which the committee is to consider is a grave one, involving issues of great importance, not to be arrived at hastily, and not likely to be encompassed at one meeting.

There are many circumstances connected with the condition and wants of the Diocese which suggest the present as an auspicious time to inaugurate a more vigorous management of our church affairs.
