TORONTO MARKETS.

TORONTO, May 26th, 1893.

DRY Goods.—Holiday celebrations have attracted many visitors to the city, and on the 25th and 26th of the month many of the wholesale houses have been thronged with visitors. It would appear that the retail trade are adopting still more generally the principle of frequent purchases and personal attendance upon the market. This is a hopeful sign of healthy business sales. Purchases consist for the most part of parasols, light dress materials, light underwear, hosiery and gloves. Although payments are but moderately good, they are fully up to last year's standard.

Fight.—A fair season's trade is doing and stocks appear moderately large. Quotations are as follows: Salmon trout, 7c.; white fish, 7c.; British Columbia salmon, 16 to 17c.; pickerel, 5 to 7c.; pike, 5c. per lb.; lake herring are sold at \$2 per 100 count. There appears to be but little demand for sea fish.

Flour and Meal.—The situation remains unsettled, and although enquiries do not appear to be numerous and transactions are very limited, dealers hold to higher quotations for straight rollers and atrong bakers' flours. We now quote: strong bakers', \$3.90 to 4.00; patents, \$3.25 to 3.40; straight rollers, \$3.10 to 3.20; extra, \$2.90 to 3.10 per barrel. Oatmeals are maintained at the recent advance. Quotations for bran are lower, at \$12 to 12.50 per ton.

GRAIN There is but little export demand, Grain.—There is but little export demand, while the local trade is far from active; winter wheat is unchanged, while spring shows an advance of 1c. per bushel. The barley season is apparently over and few or no transactions are reported. There is a good local demand for oats, quotations for which remain unchanged. Peas show but little signs of movement. Rye and corn are nominal. There is no buckwheat offering.


